## LOW-WEIGHT-GAIN ANTIPSYCHOTIC Side Effects:

Medications in this category: ARIPIPRAZOLE (Abilify), ASENAPINE (Saphris), BREXPIPRAZOLE (Rexulti), CARIPRAZINE (Vraylar), LURASIDONE (Latuda), ZIPRASIDONE (Geodon)

Most common: sedation, dizziness, restlessness, tremor, stiffness, muscle spasms, mild weight gain (which can lead to high cholesterol, high blood pressure, diabetes, heart problems, strokes, etc.), rash (occurring commonly only with ziprasidone, ~5%)

Serious but rare: head rush or lightheadedness upon standing (orthostasis), neuroleptic malignant syndrome in 0.02 to 3% (potentially fatal syndrome with fever, severe muscle rigidity, high blood pressure), tardive dyskinesia in 2% (a syndrome of potentially irreversible, involuntary movements), strokes and higher mortality in elderly patients with dementia, ziprasidone more than others can cause heart arrhythmias 0.06%, ziprasidone more than others may cause a serious rash due to drug reaction with eosinophilia and systemic symptoms (DRESS) has been found in at least 6 patients, asenepine more than others may cause allergic reactions including anaphylaxis.

Pregnancy: Fewer data available, most showing no increased risk of birth defects. Maternal hyperglycemia, impaired glucose tolerance, and weight gain may lead to maternal complications. Large-for-gestational-age infants reported.
